Agenda 3: Formation of NAAC committee and accreditation-related activities.

Under the leadership of Prof. S.C. Garg, Chairman IQAC, the committee members discussed the institution's readiness for the forthcoming NAAC assessment. Prof. Garg, with his extensive experience, underscored the critical nature of scrupulous data accumulation, astute analysis, and meticulous documentation in ensuring a successful assessment outcome. Prof Garg, firmly endorsed the proposition of constituting a dedicated task force entrusted with the pivotal role of overseeing data collection and its subsequent verification process. Dr. Pandey, Registrar, emphasized the necessity of aligning the accumulated data with the specific parameters set by NAAC for assessment.

Agenda 4: Discussion on Enhancing Teaching-Learning Practices

Hon'ble. VC, emphasized the augmentation of the institution's teaching-learning methodologies. Prof. Pandey guided the members on developing a road map for the establishment of an enriched educational environment. He introduced the idea of integrating modern technology and collaborative projects into the instructional framework. Dr. Viplav Pandey, proposed the for a faculty mentorship program, envisaging a seamless exchange of pioneering teaching practices among the faculty cohort.

Agenda 5: Implementation of Outcome-Based Education (OBE)

The Members of the IQAC were suggested to oversee the implementation of Outcome Based Education to foster dynamic student engagement. The Chairperson with a thrust on understanding of contemporary pedagogical trends accentuated the importance of congruence between program outcomes, course objectives, and assessment techniques.

Agenda 6: Exploring Strategies for Research Promotion

To promote research and innovation, creation of seed grants initiatives was proposed for both faculty and students. The committee discussed on the possibility of starting up PhD programme in Department of Agriculture and Faculty of Legal Studies. It was presented that few faculties along with students had already got their papers published in some reputed journals and many had communicated their papers, waiting for its acceptance.

Agenda 7: Collaborative Initiatives for Quality Enhancement

Students feedback and analysis report was shared and discussed with members of IQAC committee. Based on it, it was suggested to workshop enhance course outcomes and course objectives. It was also suggested to revise vocational courses to meet the dynamic work environment. One of the IQAC member-initiated discussion on forging collaborative initiatives with external institutions. It was decided to encourage collaboration with institutions to enhance quality teaching and learning.

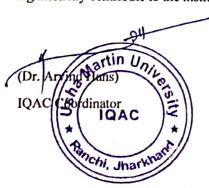
Agenda 8: Student Engagement and Feedback Mechanisms

The committee members discussed the feedback of stakeholders and ways to incorporate it at different levels. Dr. V Pandey stressed the importance of creating platforms for students to voice their opinions and concerns. He proposed the establishment of a student feedback committee composed of representatives from various departments and periodic surveys to gauge student satisfaction and identify areas for improvement.

Agenda 9: Faculty Development and Training Programs

To strengthen the professional growth of faculty members, the members were apprised about the Faculty Development initiatives taken and the plan for prepared for faculty development initiates ahead.

The meeting concluded with commitment to enhance student engagement and feedback mechanisms, as well as to invest in comprehensive faculty development and training programs. The members recognized that nurturing a learning environment that prioritizes both students and faculty would significantly contribute to the institution's pursuit of academic excellence.
